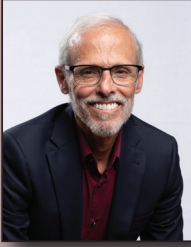

The seminar traces the historical and theological development of the Holiness Movement—from John Wesley’s Aldersgate experience and his teaching on assurance and sanctification, through the “instant sanctification” theology which gave rise to the Holiness/Pentecostal movement in the 19th century. We will highlight its Adventist expression in the 1899 Indiana “Holy Flesh” camp meeting. We will examine the dangers of this theology and practice, and the steps the church took based on Ellen G. White’s corrective counsel. And most of all what lessons we can learn from this as we prepare for Christ’s soon return.

The main goal is to help our members understand the difference between Christ-centered assurance and performance-based spirituality, and to offer a balanced, gospel-grounded framework for holiness that is deeply relevant for Adventists today. This seminar will address historical misunderstandings and contemporary challenges. It will also help Adventist know how to better relate to our Pentecostal neighbors and friends with clarity, grace, and sensitivity.

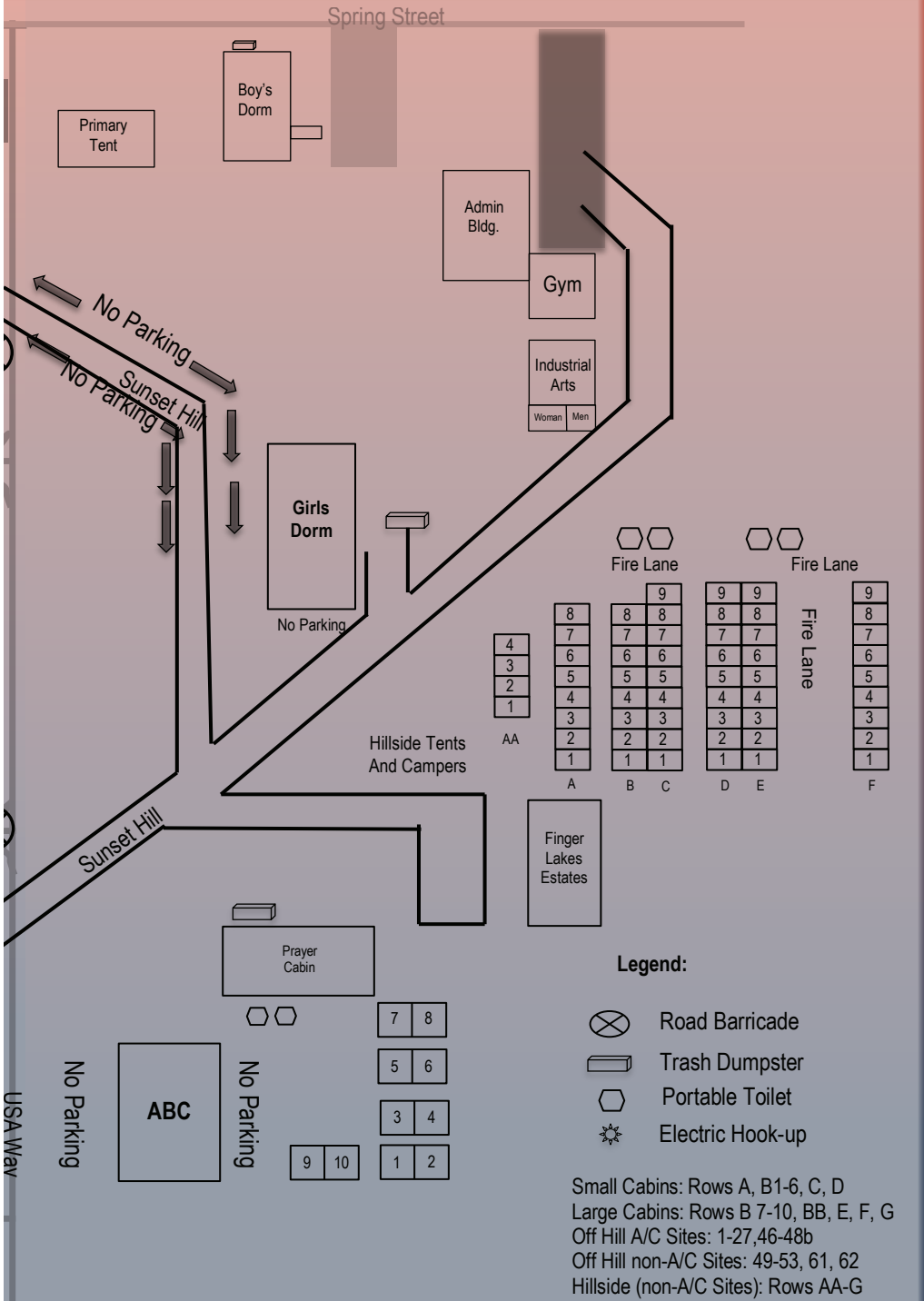
Spring Street

Cleanliness:

Please do not leave any trash in meeting areas and dispose of all trash in the proper waste containers provided. Thank you.

Curfew:

10:45 pm is quiet time and all campers are asked to be in their respective places for the night. The security gate closes at 11:00 pm.

Dorm Room Furniture

Per state regulations, we are not allowed to move or remove furniture from the dorm rooms. All furniture must remain in their original location. They cannot be put in the hallway or moved to another room.

Dress Code:

Recognizing that Christians should be modest in their dress, we encourage all campers to wear appropriate clothing.

Drones/UAV:

These are not allowed on campus unless you receive prior approval from conference administration.

Electrical:

Due to fire hazard caused by electrical overload, please DO NOT use air conditioners in the cabins or dormitory rooms.

Golf Carts:

Golf carts must be registered at Locating and are NOT permitted on campus except for use by those who are handicapped or for official use.

Parking:

Your cooperation is needed in parking your car only in the areas designated for parking. All cars parked in NO PARKING areas will be towed. Thank you for your cooperation.

Pets:

No pets (except service dogs) are permitted on the grounds at any time.

Prohibited Items:
