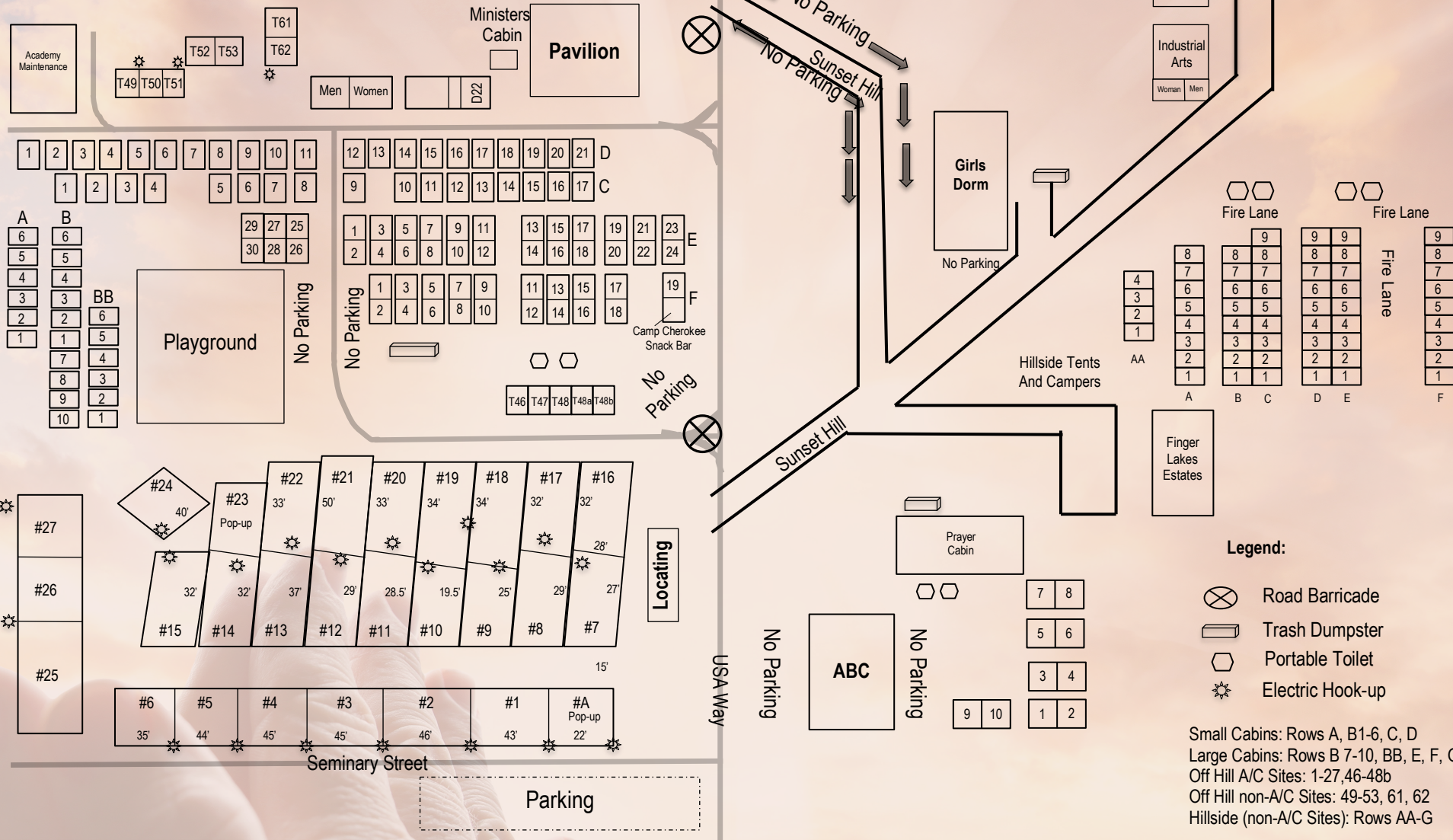




Spring Street
